

What is it?

We work together with Gloucestershire Constabulary to provide Driver Improvement Courses.

Who is it for?

The course is offered by Police as an alternative to attending court for some driving without due care and attention offences.

How does it work?

It aims to improve the driving skills, attitudes and behaviour of those taking part. It is not a soft option.

The courses are administered by the Road Safety Partnership, and delivered by carefully selected and trained, local, approved driving instructors.

When does it happen?

Courses are held all day on a Friday, or a Saturday morning, and participants are required to give up a day and a half of their time to attend, and pay the entire cost.

How much does it cost?

The current course fee is £163.00 (subject to change on 1st April 2009).

Where do I attend?

Courses are held in Gloucester - Road Safety Group, Environment Directorate, Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, GLOUCESTER, GL1 2TH.
