

What is it?

A two-day better motorcycling course, called Better Biking, organised and delivered in conjunction with Gloucestershire Constabulary.

Who is it for?

As this is a foundation for the advanced riding test, you require a full licence, and usually, a medium to larger capacity motorcycle.

How does it work?

The first day is theory-based; including an introduction to the Police Riders handbook RoadCraft, and the second day is practical riding advice and an observed ride.

When does it happen?

Each year, usually between April and October, although it may be possible to organise a course outside of these dates. Please contact us.

Better Biking is held on two consecutive Sundays between 9am - 4pm.

Dates for 2010 are:

April 18 & 25th
May 23 & 30th.
July 4 & 11th.
September 5th & 12th.
October 3 & 10th.

How much does it cost?

The course fee is £49.50.

This includes refreshments, a buffet lunch on both days, a copy of the police handbook entitled 'Motorcycle Roadcraft', a copy of the Highway Code, the theory session, and the observed ride.

Where do I attend?

The venue is Gloucestershire Community Fire Station, Eastern Avenue, Gloucester.
